Liberal Reform Party Czech Republic

Liberal Reform Party (LiRA / Liberals CZ) was established at the beginning of 2002 by a group of young Czech liberals and already in the first year of its existence, marked a major success with nomination of rector of the Masaryk University in Brno prof. Jiří Zlatuška, who became the first Senator in the Czech Parliament for LiRA / Liberals CZ.

That first year the same group of people, who founded the Party also founded liberal think-tank Institute of Karel Havlíček Borovský, with the aim to promote principles of liberalism.

In May of 2004, LiRA/Liberals CZ was a member of the Union of Liberal Democrats, a four party coalition, which run in the European Parliament elections.

In November of 2004 our party prepared election project „Green for Moravia“ for regional elections in Southern Moravia. This project resulted in seat for architect Mr. Jiří Löw, who became the first regional representative for LiRA/Liberals CZ.

The party also nominated Mr. Tomáš Ježek, „father of Czech privatization“ for the elections to the Czech Senate in 2004.

In between elections LiRA/Liberals CZ actively initiates negotiations between Czech political parties and also Mr. Milan Hamerský, chairman of LiRA/Liberals CZ, periodically writes articles for major Czech newspaper, where he states his opinions and viewpoints on current topics in Czech politics.

By all these self-funded activities, Liberal Reform Party actively promotes liberalism in the Czech society and will continue to do so in the future.


